The doors of the Highland House Museum will open for the season at 10:00 AM on Saturday, June 1st with an exhibition inspired by historical photographs of Truro. Nine noted local photographers have agreed to re-shoot the subjects of these photographs as they appear today. These modern photos will be paired with their historical counterparts for display throughout the summer season, hence "Truro – Then and Now." The photographers will showcase further their talents by producing pictorial, or artistic, versions of these historical subjects.

At 5:00 PM, join us at an opening reception to meet the photographers, enjoy refreshments, and peruse the photos which will be on sale in limited editions to raise funds for the historic Highland House Museum.

"Edward and Josephine Hopper in Truro"



Edward Hopper is considered one of the most famous and influential American painters. Not many people, even in Truro, know that he and Josephine Hopper spent thirty-seven summers in Truro from 1930 to 1966. In July and August, we will present a series of events to commemorate their "working vacations" in South Truro.

Our Wednesday evening speakers will include Hopper experts such as renowned author and former Whitney Museum of American Art curator Gail Levin, local Hopper tour guide Beth Chapman, and Elizabeth Colleary, consultant to the Whitney Museum Hopper collection and expert on Jo Hopper. Dates will be posted shortly.

Our August 17th fundraising event will feature two members of the Whitney Museum of American Art's curatorial staff, Nicholas Robbins and Kimia Shahi. Both played an influential role in developing the Whitney's new exhibition, "Hopper's Drawings," opening in New York in May. Last summer and fall, Ms. Shahi conducted research on Edward Hopper in Truro for the Whitney exhibition.

Our festivities will include cocktails and hors d'oeuvres catered by Cosmos Catering, a silent auction of Hopper-themed mini-cranberry boxes designed by Lower Cape artists, and an exhibition and sale of interpretive photos of Truro houses and scenes painted by Edward Hopper. We have collected a handful of Edward Hopper's drawings and Jo Hopper's paintings for display and hope to locate more.
