Dig Into Reading

It's time for the annual T.C.S.
Reading Challenge. This event
encourages school-wide reading each
March through May, and this year, the
theme is "Dig Into Reading". It's
inspired by our school initiative to think
about growing local — in our raised
garden beds and through our popular
Farm-to-School lunch program.

Our goal is to read 1,000 books by the end of May. All T.C.S. students and staff are encouraged to participate and participation is easy and fun! Start by reading a book and then tell an adult about it. Fill in a petal on a flower that helps you chart your progress. When you have filled up a flower (4 petals), bring it to school. You get to "dig" around in a giant box of polished gemstones and put it into a personalized pouch. Read more books, collect more gemstones. If we reach the 1,000 book goal, there will be a special all-school prize. Clues to the identity of the all-school prize are revealed after each 200 books.
