Hoppers in Truro

Annual Fundraiser for the Highland House Museum: August 17, 6:00 to 8:00 PM

Join us for a wine and hors d'oeuvres reception elegantly presented by Cosmos Catering. The event features a gallery talk by two members of the curatorial staff of the Whitney Museum of American Art based on their research in Truro and their role in writing the catalog for the current Whitney exhibition, "Hopper Drawing." Kimia Shahi did the research in Truro on Edward Hopper's reliance on the role of the automobile and the road in finding inspiration for his paintings, especially after the 1930s; and Nicholas Robbins was the author of the remarkable chapter, "The Road," in the "Hopper Drawing" exhibition catalog. This will not be a lecture, but an illustrated revelation of how a theme germinates and transforms into an exhibition that has received critical acclaim for its analysis of Hopper's creative process.

Hopper Exhibition Opens at the Highland House: Through September 30

A lively crowd showed up at the opening of the "Edward and Josephine Hopper in Truro" exhibition on July 27. The exhibition covers the convergence of their personal lives and careers in the 1920s, their arrival in South Truro in 1930, and the evolution of their marriage and painting careers over four decades of Truro summers.

You'll learn a lot, even if you've lived here a long time! The centerpiece is a

pair of maps in color of Truro and South Truro drawn by Jo Hopper and shown on paper and digitally on a big screen. Viewers can match many of the houses committed to oil paintings or watercolors by Edward Hopper with their locations on the maps.
