Original nude practice sketches by Courtney Allen

As one of the original founders and first president of the Truro Historical Society, Courtney Allen (1898-1969), world-renowned artist and sculptor, gifted the THS with his lifetime collection of practice sketches which document the evolution of his talents and techniques. View this specially selected collection of nude sketches dating from 1919 through 1967. It was his wish that this collection be used as a fund raising tool for the Society. A limited number of these beautiful works of art will be for sale to the public during the off-season months. The sketches are backed on acid free core-board and protected by an acid free plastic sleeve. Each sketch includes documentation from the Truro Historical Society that it is a Courtney Allen original.
