Non-fiction

Stitches: A Handbook on Meaning, Hope and Repair by Annie Lamott is nothing less than an effort to a wise and compassionate exploration of how we can make sense of life's chaos. What do we do when life lurches out of balance? How can we reconnect to one other and to what's sustaining when evil and catastrophe seem inescapable?

The Investigator: Fifty Years of Uncovering the Truth by Terry Lenzner is a captivating account of his career at the Justice Department, one of which inspired the film, *Mississippi Burning*.

The Map and the Territory by Alan Greenspan integrates the history of economic prediction, the new work of behavioral economists, and his own experience to offer a lucid grounding in what we can (and what we can't) know about economic forecasting.

Fiction

Fifteen Minutes by Karen Kingsbury is a dramatic story about fame, true love, and the cost of having it all.

Mrs. Poe by Lynn Cullen is inspired by a true-life love triangle that involved Edgar Allen Poe. Reviewed as "intelligent, sexy, and utterly addictive".
