5 Rules of Internet Safety

- 2) I will ask my trusted adult before sharing private information like my name, address, school, photos and phone number.
- 3) I will not meet anyone face-to-face from the Internet.
- 4) I will always use good “netiquette” and not be rude, mean or cyberbully online.
- 5) I will always let my trusted adult know when I am online. Always!
