Remembering Dear Friends

In Fond Memory of Joyce Johnson

We were deeply saddened to hear of the passing of our dear Highlands Center partner, Joyce Johnson, in April. Joyce spent her life creating and serving others through her teaching and inspiration. She accomplished so many things and chronicled Cape life through her reporting for local newspapers and longstanding *The Sands of Time* program on WOMR. In addition to founding the Truro Center for the Arts at Castle Hill and championing preservation of the Peaked Hill Bars dune shacks, Joyce exhibited passion, tenacity, a sense of humor, kindness, and she made lasting contributions to the Highlands Center as an original board member who stayed the course. Joyce has been a one-of-a-kind great soul, and a tremendous sculptor, writer, and teacher who has left her mark with us.

Tribute to Guy Strauss

Another great loss to the partners this winter was the passing of Guy Strauss, founding Artistic Director of Payomet Performing Arts Center in Truro for 10 years. He was a professional actor with roles in theater, film, and television. Guy was a passionate person and the pioneering partner who started *Shakespeare at the Shore* in the picnic grove before moving the tent to the Highlands Center. He will be remembered for being witty, a theatrical force who enjoyed performing great readings and plays, and being involved with the seashore for many years including serving on the board of Friends of the Cape Cod National Seashore.

New Neighbors

The Highlands Center has a new short-term neighbor on the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) property on the bluff. A MIT Lincoln Labs Satellite Communications Temporary Research Facility has been set up at the site until October 2014. Research will be conducted through communications via antenna from land in association with aircraft flights and boats at sea. The research is fitting for a town that hosted MIT and the military in development of radar technology in the Center's former life as an air force station.
