## **Thematic Workshop: Multiple Sets**

In this class you will learn how to make pots of the same shape and size in multiples and sets. A set of matching mugs, plates, bowls for example.

Or even a complete dinnerware place setting for two or four or more! Because the class will focus on multiples of the same form, it is an excellent opportunity to practice and develop your throwing skills even if you choose not to make a matching set of objects. We'll go over basic functional forms such as plates, bowls, mugs and pitchers. The class will culminate in a reduction glaze firing so that your pots are ready for use and gifting this holiday season. Please note the schedule of this class, as it will meet twice a week for part of the session.

**Paul Wisotzky** is a potter and teacher working out of his studio Blueberry Lane Pottery in Truro, Massachusetts. Paul makes pottery that is for everyday use. Whether it's a treasured favorite mug for the first cup of coffee or a vase for flowers that brightens any room, he strives to make each piece a pleasure to hold and behold. Paul works in porcelain and stoneware and fires in reduction and soda atmospheres. Paul has been a winter resident and studio/technical assistant at the Penland School of

Crafts. He has also served as a studio assistant at the Haystack Mountain School of Crafts.
